




Kansas Writing Instruction & Evaluation Tool (KWIET): An Overview for Educators



The **Kansas Writing Instruction and Evaluation Tool (KWiet)** is an online environment where students compose pieces of writing in response to writing tasks and where teachers evaluate, score, and provide feedback upon that student writing.

Available for state, district, school, and classroom writing tasks at all grade levels, KWiet becomes—in essence—an online portfolio of student writing that allows educators to track student writing progress over time.

And because KWiet is an online tool, it follows each student across grade levels, buildings, and districts within the state of Kansas.



Activating Background Experience

How many of us tire of dragging stacks of papers back and forth from school to home for grading?

When grading, how often do we find ourselves wishing we could see the student's previous draft, pre-writing, or peer-response to better understand what we are reading?

How often do we find ourselves wishing we could see what a student has written in previous classes or previous grade-levels to better understand that student's "unique" learning history?

How often do our students lament the fact that they have either lost or no longer have access to something they have written?



A Multiphase Process of Creation and Refinement

Phase I

Available Oct. 2010*

*for a limited number of pilot classrooms

Features:

- Make use of KIDS and SCRS data
- Student interface is active
- Include KSDE Instructional Example Prompts to spur student writing

Phase II

Available Feb. 2011

Added Features:

- Teacher interface active
- Teachers can use KSDE Instructional Example Prompts or create their own prompts to spur student writing
- Limited scoring capacity
- Reporting features will be active

Phase III

Available Sept. 2011

Added Features:

- Collaboration tab is active in student interface for peer revision
- Ability to create/adapt rubrics for individual tasks
- Capacity for scorers to document feedback on student's work

Phase IV

Available Aug. 2012

Added Features:

- Side-by-side pre-writing and drafting
- Human scoring via interactive rubrics
- Building- and district-level logins available for administrators
- Availability for the Kansas Writing Assessment



To begin using the Kansas Writing Instruction and Evaluation Tool's teacher portal, select one of the following options from the navigation tool bar above:

- **Prompt:** Create or edit your own prompts or search for prompts.
- **Rubric:** Create or edit your own rubrics or search for rubrics.
- **Task:** Create or edit your own tasks or search for tasks.
- **Task Administrations:** Create or edit your own task administration windows or search for task administration.
- **Enrollment:** Enroll or un-enroll students in tasks or reactivate student enrollments. Schedule student to collaborate and respond to drafted tasks. Change the task administration window for enrollments.
- **Score Tasks:** View or print responses for completed tasks and assign scores and add comments on student responses.
- **Reports:** View aggregate reports by student, class, grade, and task.
- **Logout:** Log out of KWIET.

Note: Prompts, Rubrics, Tasks, and Task Administrations you create will be available to you and other educators in your building to view and use. Only you will be able to edit these items.





Create Prompt

Example

Prompt Title: A Memorable Teacher

Writing Situation: Think of a memorable teacher from your past. Remember an experience from his or her classroom. Such experiences might include a great lesson, a time when the teacher helped you through a problem, or a new way of helping you learn.

Directions for Writing: Write to a group of parents about a memorable teacher in your life. Help your audience to understand why that teacher was important and so memorable by explaining what happened, how you felt, and why you remember it. Use sensory detail to convey your ideas and build excitement in the mind of the reader. Show your audience what happened; don't just tell them.

Directions:

After entering the task name and selecting a grade, you must select at least one prompt for the task.

In the left box are prompts available to use in this task. In the right box, prompts you select for this task will appear in the order in which the student will see the prompts.

Select the prompts you would like from the left box and use the arrows to move them to the right box. Using SHIFT-click or CTL-click, you can select more than one at a time.

Before saving the task, review the order of the questions in the right box. This is the order the questions will be displayed to the student. Use the up and down arrows to change the order of the prompts. When finished, click the Save Task button.

To begin, select your class from "Available Classes," select grade from "Available Grades," and select a task from "Available Tasks."

Schedule Tasks/Reactivate Students/Schedule Collaboration

To **schedule tasks**, click on the boxes in the Enroll or Un-enroll column. To enroll all students for a task, click on "Select All" in that column. When you are finished, click on the "Schedule Students" button.

To **reactivate tasks**, click on the boxes in the Reactivate column. To reactivate the tasks for all students, click on "Select All" in that column. When you are finished, click on the "Schedule Students" button. A student's task will only need to be reactivated if that student has Confirmed his or her writing in the Publication tab. Reactivation will not erase student responses or scores.

If checkboxes are shown in the grade column for a student, that student is enrolled in multiple grades. A student should only be enrolled for one grade, and the invalid grade should be disabled. To **disable a grade**, click on the box in the Grade column next to the incorrect grade. When you are finished, click on the Disable button. This will remove the student from the incorrect grade.

Remember, a student cannot save to the Collaboration tab until that student is scheduled for collaboration by the teacher. A student cannot save to the Collaboration tab until that student is scheduled for collaboration by the teacher. **Schedule students for collaboration at this time or as students finish their drafts.** If students are not scheduled for collaboration, they will move from the Drafting tab to the Publication tab.






