In 2013, Scott Dual Language School started the process to become entirely dual language after being identified as a priority school. After being awarded a School Improvement Grant (SIG) in 2013 and developing a plan that implemented a dual language program, Scott was awarded the 3rd best dual language immersion school in the nation by the Embassy of Spain in spring 2015. A big piece of this transformation process was the change in the school culture which included a clear framework for behavior and academics as well as increasing parental involvement. Recent research shows that our English Language Learners (ELL's) in the Dual Language program are scoring significantly higher than ELL's in the traditional pullout program. Participants will learn and acquire the important components that support Scott's process of generating a new school culture to build an effective Dual Language program and how to overcome barriers.
