At Abilene High School, students practice phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension at their instructional level through a data based MTSS process without losing electives. Using technology, teachers, and individualized instruction, AHS consistently decreases struggling/below level readers each year. The Post-graduation data for AHS shows that less than 5% of our students require remediation in English at the college level.
