

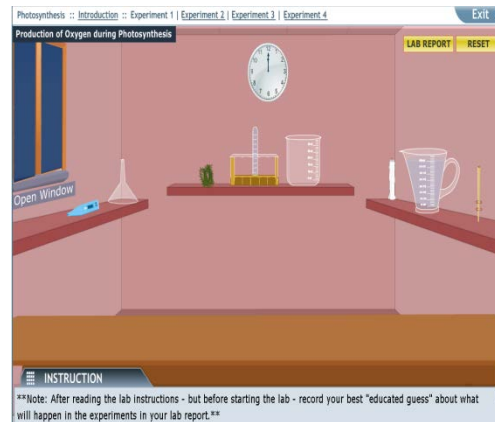
Engaging Curriculum: Multimedia Content Examples
