Kansas Agriculture Skills & Competencies Certificate

Agriculture employs more than 11% of Kansans and is the largest sector of the state's economy.

Certificate Requirements

- 1. Must have completed three high school agricultural education credits.
- 2. Must have been an FFA member for at least two years.
- 3. Complete either of the following Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE) documentation:

a. Completed proficiency award application and deemed acceptable at district level, according to the entrepreneurship and placement proficiency award evaluation.

b. Earned State FFA Degree

- 4. Cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher in all courses, not just agriculture classes.
- 5. Participate in one leadership event Career Development Event (CDE) and one technical CDE.

6. Satisfactorily complete the comprehensive Agriculture Assessment, level to be considered satisfactory to be determined by the KSDE Education Program Consultant, in consultation with KDA, following the pilot test in spring 2013.

7. As part of the application, students will be asked to select at least five, but up to 10, skills and competencies they have gained through their participation in above activities as reviewed by advisor.

This certificate has been endorsed by the Kansas agricultural community, including Kansas FFA Foundation, Kansas Farm Bureau, Kansas Grain & Feed Association, Kansas Livestock Association and other industry organizations and employers.

Certificates will be awarded starting in May 2014.

The Kansas Agriculture Skills and Competencies Certificate will document skills and competencies gained by student participation in agricultural education. The program is an opportunity to quantify and qualify skills gained through the completion of all three segments of the agriculture education model.
