- ACT Study
 - Examine how 10th grade KAP results and ACT scores are related
 - Are KAP scores a good predictor of ACT scores?
 - ACT composite and subject scores
 - Probability of students' meeting ACT subject benchmark
 - Still time to volunteer school ACT data
 - Report to the Kansas State Board of Education in the spring



2017 – Lexile and Quantile Reports

- A Lexile measure represents both a student's reading ability and the difficulty of a text, such as a book or magazine article.
- Quantile measure represents both a student's mathematical achievement and the difficulty of a mathematical skill or concept.
- Linked to state assessment scores the metrics can help parents and educators find leveled materials for students.



2017 – ISTATION

- The Kansas Reading Success Initiative provides free and unlimited use of the Istation Reading Program grades PreK – 8th both at school and at home.
- Goal is to have every child meet their full reading potential.
 - Engage children to learn to read & read to learn!



2018 and Beyond

- The Kansas College & Career Ready Standards in math and ELA are currently under review.
- Anticipated recommendations will be presented to the Kansas State Board of Education sometime during the fall of 2017.
- NO assessment changes are anticipated for the 2017-2018 test administration.



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
