In this session presenters will provide background on teen dating violence, discuss the obligations K-12 schools have to address these issues, and describe how schools can better promote healthy relationship behaviors. One in four adolescents will be the victim of physical, sexual, emotional, or verbal abuse from a dating partner. Only 33% of teens who have been in violent relationships told anyone about the abuse. Teen dating violence is a preventable public health problem which requires a comprehensive strategy to stop it before it starts. Jana's Campaign, a Kansas-based education and gender violence prevention organization, has worked in over 90 middle and high schools throughout Kansas helping students, teachers, counselors, and communities better address these issues through it's "Love Doesn't Hurt" program. Participants in this session will leave with innovative ideas about preventing teen dating violence in their schools and communities.
