Oxford Elementary students became very interested in wind energy after visiting the site of a local wind farm. Students applied to be a part of teams to work on the KidWind Challenge. For this challenge, students were asked to construct their own wind turbine to be tested and judged. Our 5th and 6th grade teams were some of the youngest teams that participated in the competition, which was held in Manhattan, KS. They had opportunities to test and modify their designs, which were created out of 100% recycled materials. All of our teams placed very well at the Manhattan competition, with one team receiving an exclusive invitation to compete in the National KidWind Challenge in New Orleans. During this presentation, our students will showcase the learning process they went through while working on the wind competition.

Session Description

This session will get at the heart of student learning. Research indicates that the single most powerful, school-based factor influencing student learning is quality of teaching. Charlotte Danielson (2009) states, "Of all the approaches available to educators to promote teacher learning, the most powerful...is that of professional conversation...In these conversations, teacher must consider the instructional decisions they have made and examine student learning in light of those decisions." In order to conduct meaningful professional conversations, instructional leaders need data. The Digital eWalkThrough System generates this data. As opposed to emotional or subjective suppositions, eWalkThrough data becomes the basis for instructional conversations. Instructional leaders from Emporia School District will share the power of focusing on reflection and conversation surrounding classroom observation. Data can be collected, disaggregated, analyzed, and archived.
