



Attendance




Highland Park High School Attendance Rate 2010 - 2012



Reading Assessment




Highland Park High School Kansas State Reading Proficiency 2010 - 2012



Math Assessment




Highland Park High School Kansas State Math Proficiency 2010 - 2012


Highland Park High School # of Suspensions

TEACHING PRACTICES (Teacher)

ENVIRONMENT: How does the environment promote student engagement?

- Orderly, well-managed environment conducive to learning
- Clear expectations for student behavior
- Manages routines, procedures, and transitions
- Clear expectations for equitable student participation
- All adults are engaged in instructional activities
- Positive student-teacher interactions
- Respect for unique differences of students
- Evidence of student work

LEARNING PRACTICES (Students)

ENVIRONMENTS: In what ways do students contribute to a safe, orderly environment that promotes student engagement and high level thinking?

- Follows expected behaviors
- Demonstrates positive student-student interactions
- Demonstrates respect for teacher and peers
- Demonstrates willingness to participate and learn

INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN: What evidence demonstrates that thoughtful level of planning has occurred to promote engagement and high level thinking?

- Unit or lesson learning target(s) communicated orally and in writing
- Differentiates to match student learning needs and strengths
- Activates prior knowledge/academic vocabulary
- Uses real-world or interdisciplinary connections
- Checks for understanding to assess and inform instruction
- Provides students with immediate and continuous feedback

STUDENT INTERACTION WITH THE LEARNING TASK: In what ways are students interacting with the curriculum that leads to engagement and high levels of thinking?

- Asks and answers higher level questions
- Investigates and solves problems
- Engages in active learning (e.g., discussion; notetaking)
- Participates in cooperative groups and dialogues about the learning task
- Participates in individual reflection (metacognition)
- Uses technology in the learning process

Estimate the percent of students actively engaged and select the appropriate range:

- 0 - 74% 75 - 89% 90 - 100%

INSTRUCTIONAL DELIVERY: What best practice strategies are being used to promote engagement and high level thinking?

Targets these research-based practices to accelerate learning:

- Reinforcing effort and providing recognition
- Use cooperative learning
- Set goals and provide feedback
- Use manipulatives and concrete objects to promote conceptual understanding
- Use balanced literacy components
- Use vocabulary strategies
- Use the six writing traits
- Use TTSS strategies

DEMONSTRATION OF THE LEARNING: How does the student work to demonstrate engagement and learning at high levels?

- Demonstrates responsibility for learning and can explain why it is important
- Answers questions and or/engages in discussions that demonstrate learning
- Engages in peer or self-assessment of the learning
- Engages in assigned activities
