

How we gather facts and categorize what we see, hear, and read. Identifying letters, words, or an author's style are recognition tasks.



Present information and content in different ways

The "how" of learning



Planning and performing tasks. How we organize and express our ideas. Writing an essay or solving a math problem are strategic tasks.



Differentiate the ways that students can express what they know

More ways to provide Multiple Means of Action and Expression

Affective Networks

The "why" of learning



How learners get engaged and stay motivated. How they are challenged, excited, or interested. These are affective dimensions.



Stimulate interest and motivation for learning

More ways to provide Multiple Means of Engagement

- Control Center (Swipe up from bottom)
 - Access on Lock Screen & Access within apps
 - If a student struggles with swiping the control center up when on an app you can turn it off
 - Airplane Mode and Pop Up adds
 - Volume
 - Brightness
 - Airdrop
 - Lock rotation/Mute button

- Settings-General
 - -Siri
 - Must be connected to internet
 - Allowing "Hey Siri" (must have iPad plugged in)
 - Language and Gender
 - App launching ("Launch _____")
 - Circle time:
 - -Calendar
 - -Weather

- Settings-General
 - Siri (Continued)
 - Set an alarm or timer for an activity (could have "Hey Siri" option on and not have to interrupt group to set alarm for another kiddo ☺)
 - Taking Notes in class ("Note...")
 - Web search ("Search the web for...")
 - Dictation within apps requiring typing (see keyboard)

Dictation Commands:

Cap - Capitalize the first letter in the next word

New line - create a new paragraph

Comma – add comma punctuation

Period – add period punctuation

Exclamation point – add exclamation punctuation

 - -Spotlight search
 - Accessibility

 - Commands:
 - » Tap to select
 - » Double tap to activate selected item
 - » Swipe to scroll to next item
 - Speaking rate
 - Braille

- Settings-General
 - Accessibility
 - Zoom
 - Invert Colors
 - Grayscale
 - Speech
 - Toggle for the speak button to appear when text is selected
 - Speak Screen option
 - Voices (higher quality voices take more memory)
 - Highlight content option
 - Larger Text
 - Bold Text (requires you to restart iPad)

- Settings-General
 - Accessibility
 - Button Shapes (outlines all buttons)
 - Increase Contrast
 - Darken Colors
 - Reduce white point (possibly beneficial for students with autism)
 - Reduce Motion (weird setting but might benefit some students who have visual processing issues)
 - Hearing aids
 - Guided Access
 - Turn on and then triple click home button within selected app
 - Can set time limits and other options

- Settings-General
 - Accessibility
 - Switch Access
 - Assistive Touch (easier access without having to activate the home button, control center, or volume controls)
 - Home click speed
 - Multitasking Gestures
 - Restrictions
 - Disallow access to Safari and other iPad components
 - Limit access to explicit content
 - Limited access to websites on Safari
 - Restrict volume changes (save your sanity)
 - Restrict deleting apps

- Settings-General
 - Keyboard
 - Adding keyboards (Emoji)
 - Creating shortcuts
 - Keyboard options
- Display & Brightness
 - Text size
 - Bold text
- Sounds (keyboard clicks)
- Facetime (if a student is unable to attend a class in that setting, you could potentially facetime the class session to their setting)

- Other tips and tricks
 - Undo (Shake iPad-but not too hard ☺)
 - Adding a website as an "app" on the home screen
 - Go to website, click share button, and select "add to home screen"
 - Screenshot (Home and Power button simultaneously)
 - Hit top of screen to go back to top of a page
 - Holding down the "." to access ".com, .org., .edu..."

Methods of Evaluating Apps


Factors to consider:

- Cost
- Curriculum alignment
- Curriculum comprehensiveness
- Targeted skills
- Use with multiple students

Typically each individual or district will decide on their own evaluation factors
