



 - Core beliefs in isolation




Core Value Creation Process




Implementing the 11 Principles of Character Education

Promotes core ethical and performance values


- Student, staff, parent & community input, District Task

Defines "character" to include thinking, feeling, and doing







CHARACTER CARD SYSTEM AT VCIS


■ Number of Detentions
