Goals of Character Development Program

Improve Circle High School Climate

- Lower discipline referrals
- Improve school attendance
- Increase involvement of students in school activities

Improve school building and community relationships

- Improve student-faculty relationships
- Improve school-community communication and relationships
- Increase community involvement at the school

Improve academic performance

- Increase the level of academic intrinsic motivation and responsibility
- Improve standardized test scores
- Prepare students to become career and college ready

School Structure - FIT

Faculty Improvement Team (FIT)

- Began in January, 2011
- Volunteer membership
- Problem-solving among the faculty
- Uses consensus decision-making
- P2A was the first topic of conversation (2010-11 all students did P2L units 1 – 4)
- Allowed faculty opinions to be shared
- Spent the entire semester discussing value of the program and implementation ideas
- Some frustration among members that other topics of importance were not being discussed

School Structure - CDC

Character Development Committee (CDC)

- Began in August, 2011
- Character development/P2A is the sole focus of this group
- 2011-12 freshmen do P2A units 1 4, all others do lessons 5 8
- Development of units for juniors and seniors
- Following year they evaluated the program for the juniors and seniors
- Planned for improvement for the following year
- Teacher involvement was key
- Worked on the National School of Character application

School Structure - SCT

School Climate Team (SCT)

- Members include school faculty and staff, community members/parents, students
- Review grant budget
- Helped with core value decision-making
- May bring other concerns to the table
- Hear updates and give feedback on all aspects of character development at CHS

Our Curriculum

- 50 minutes, once a week program
- Separated by grade level
- Includes over 95% of student body
- Working to align with the Kansas SECD Standards
