








Handwriting Helps Written Expression



- Students wrote longer essays and had faster word production when handwriting as compared to keyboarding. (Berninger, 2008)
- •More ideas were expressed and more complete sentences were produced in students utilizing handwriting as compared to keyboarding. (Berninger, Abbott, Augsburger, & Garcia, 2009)

"The orthographic-motor skills involved in handwriting have a significant effect on students' ability to generate written text." (D. Jones and C. Christensen)


"Devotion of ... working memory to control lower-level processing, such as handwriting, leaves little working memory capacity left for ... written expression." (Gathercole et al.)








Handwriting and Academic Success



 Brain Imaging (fMRI's) have shown that the serial finger movement (of handwriting) activates regions in the brain associated with cognitive, metacognitive, and language processes in writers. (Richards, Berninger & Stock, 2009)





Handwriting Instruction is Important

✓ Students still need to know how to write by hand. National Handwriting Survey

(Graham, Harris, Mason, Fink-Chorzempa, Moran, Saddler)

- Only 39% said students' handwriting was adequate.
- 80% said students needed more time to complete assignments due to slow handwriting.
- 68% said inferior handwriting had a negative impact on writing quality.

Handwriting Instruction is Important?

✓ Good Handwriting makes a good impression.

Handwriting is often a criteria used to judge a person's intelligence and level of education. -Bob Schlagal

✓ Students with good handwriting score better on tests.

Neatly handwritten essays receive significantly higher scores on standardized writing assessments.-

(Chase, 1986; Briggs 1980; Hughes, Keeling, & Tucker, 1983)





Handwriting Instruction is Important

The act of handwriting improves spelling word learning.

 The motor act of producing a word by handwriting results in tactile sensations in the brain that helps creates an envelope that links letters into a single written word unit. (Richards, Berninger, & Fayol, 2009)

Manuscript vs. Cursive

Preliminary Study of College Student

- Looked at note taking from a lecture.
 - 3 groups
 - Printing
 - Cursive
 - Keyboarding
 - Quiz After







Preliminary Results

- Cursive and printing notes by hand have the same direct recall ability and inference abilities immediately after lecture.
- Keyboarding only direct recall. Students who took notes by hand demonstrated the ability to infer.
- Cursive writers recalled more information one week later.

KANSAS HANDWRITING CURRICULAR STANDARDS August 2013

The Kansas State Board of Education believes that cursive handwriting as a student skill still holds an important place in the instructional practice of every school's curriculum and can be integrated in multiple content areas. Research supports the role that handwriting instruction plays in the cognitive development of children and this activity is even more important in an increasingly digital environment. The Board strongly encourages educators to ensure that all students can write legibly in cursive and comprehend text written in this manner.




Teaching the Letters: Building Imagery

The purpose of the first step in teaching each letter is to help the students develop a clear mental image of the letter to be written. Appropriate questions about the letter help the students develop the image. The teacher is then asked to model, or demonstrate, the letter on the chalkboard, on large chart paper, or in the air, giving attention to the letter and its description, to establish motor image.








Step 2: Practice


- 1. Remind students about the 3 P's
- 2. Ask student to trace the shaded letters
- 3. Tell students to stop and check.

Step 3: Apply and Evaluate

- 1. Remind students about the importance of legibility
- 2. Ask student to finish the page and to stop and check
- 3. Tell students to evaluate
